You're probably already going to be feeling nervous, so the last thing you need is any stress from your photographer. You need to hire someone you can trust to turn up on the day, not 'give the game away', and do a great job of capturing this hugely special moment in your relationship.

There's a lot to think about! Grab a cup of coffee, sit back and relax while I answer your questions about your proposal photography!





What's your style of photography?

I'll capture the proposal and all the emotions involved!

Once you've had plenty of time to absorb this special moment, we'll move into the rest of your photoshoot, which will, ideally, involve natural images, particularly outdoors, in beautiful, soft light.

I'll give you some guidance so that you look your absolute best, but I'll do this in a way that doesn't spoil the fun or kill the spontaneity.

Of course, I will also be sure to photograph the ring!

Where should I propose?

I LOVE working with natural light and beautiful scenery, so prefer to be outdoors if at all possible. However, I'm also happy to work indoors, especially if the weather isn't great.

I know the Highlands like the back of my hand and can suggest some great locations, depending on the type of scenery that you'd like.

Personally, I recommend choosing somewhere quiet, as opposed to a busy tourist hotspot. This way, the proposal will be a private moment between you and your partner, without an audience. With my zoom lenses, I can capture close-up shots of you, whilst staying out of earshot. Not everyone follows this advice though and I'll respect your decision if we end up at a busy tourist spot! When planning the exact spot to propose, give some thought to the practicalities.

Kyle, pictured here, initially chose the base of a large waterfall. Fortunately, I knew the location and was able to advise him that, not only was the access dodgy, but that the noise of the water would have been so loud that Ellie, his partner, probably wouldn't have been able to hear what he was saying!

Kyle then planned to propose on a narrow wooden footbridge, with me photographing from a distance. However, I wouldn't have been able to see Kyle if he'd been down on one knee! Also, if Ellie had leaned down towards him, I would have seen nothing!

Thankfully, Kyle took my advice on board and chose a beautiful, quiet location on the shore of Loch Cluanie, where I had a clear view of the happy couple.

If you get in touch with me, I'll gladly share my favourite locations with you!

How do I go about planning this?!


There's a lot to think about! We want to ensure you get perfect images without 'giving the game away'... you don't want your partner to suspect that you're about to propose!

I'll share a few scenarios that I'm happy to recommend. Hopefully these will inspire you, and one of them will feel like the right fit for you and your partner.

Option 1: Propose on your day out Option 2: Propose during a couples' photoshoot Option 3: Show up unexpectedly and propose

Read on...!





Option 1: Propose on your day out

In this scenario, you might (for instance) plan to go on a hike or visit a historic site of interest. We'll need to arrange a very specific location for the proposal, and a time. I'll arrive at the location before you and will be waiting, doing my best to look like a tourist, with one of my cameras hidden!

On the day, we would communicate beforehand; I'd want to know what you were wearing so that I could easily spot you, particularly if there are other people around. I'll only spring into action with my cameras when you get down on one knee to propose. I'm very discreet and I promise that your partner won't suspect a thing!

Once you've had time to absorb the big moment together, I'll step forward to introduce myself! We'll then head into the rest of the photoshoot, and I'll gently guide you both throughout. I appreciate all of this will be a complete surprise for your partner and he/she might want a few minutes to go and freshen up first. No problem!

Option 2: Propose during a couples' photoshoot

In this scenario, you and your partner would book a couples' photoshoot with me, and you'd do the proposal part way through the session. The benefit of this scenario is that you could plan what to wear together, and your partner would be primed and ready for the photoshoot, perhaps even with hair, make-up and nails done.

Don't worry, I would be very careful not to 'give the game away' to your partner. The best approach would be to propose, say, half way through the photoshoot. I would suggest leaving the best locations for the second half of the photoshoot, by which time you'd both be used to being in front of my camera. In reality, we'd be saving the best location for the proposal and capturing all the emotions that follow!

Option 3: Show up unexpectedly and propose

In this scenario, you'd need to include friends or family in your plans. They would organise a day out with your partner, perhaps on a hike or visit to a site of historic interest.

When they arrive, your partner would be surprised to see you, and you could immediately get down on one knee and propose.

The advantage of this approach is that you and I would meet before the big moment and could discuss the exact location for popping the question. I would then give you plenty space (I know you'd be feeling nervous) and would hide until your partner arrives. We could also capture a few photos with your friends/family afterwards.

Where should we be in relation to the camera?

It's really important that I get a good view of your partner's reaction.


Ideally you want to take note of my position and opt for one of the following options: 1) have your partner face in my general direction; or 2) both be side on to the camera.

My top tip for setting this up is to guide your partner to a particular spot, pretending that you're going to take their photograph. Instead of pulling out your phone/camera, simply pull out the ring instead!

You could even have your partner facing away from you as you do this, then ask them to turn around!







Do you travel, or hike to remote locations?

I'm based on the Black Isle so I do most of my work in the Inverness area. If you want to do your proposal further afield, then we can discuss an additional fee to cover my travel.

I love hiking and hill walking. However, if you're planning on proposing somewhere remote, please be aware that I would need to charge you extra for time spent hiking and lugging 15kg of camera gear around!





What if the weather's poor?

This is Scotland; the weather is the one thing that's beyond our control!

I'm no stranger to being outdoors in poor weather. I photograph a lot of weddings and, naturally, these go ahead regardless of the weather conditions on the day. So, I can cope with whatever the weather throws at us and I'm happy to embrace the elements if you are. My only stipulation is that I would need to have the rain at my back when photographing the proposal; we don't want raindrops running down my camera lens!

However, if you desperately want decent weather for the proposal and subsequent photoshoot, then we can plan for a specific date and time but aim to be flexible in the event of a particularly bad weather forecast (i.e. heavy rain, high winds or thick fog). I should mention that, quite often, the weather forecast is only reliable a couple of days in advance (unless we're experiencing a long spell of settled weather). The best approach is to keep me posted on your availability and aim to be flexible.

What time of day is best?

I'm much more concerned about the weather conditions than the time of day.

I've no problem with photographing in the middle of the day, when the sun is high in the sky. However, if it is a sunny day, I'll be seeking some shade (for, at least, part of your photoshoot) in order to find some soft, flattering light.

Please note that, ideally, I would like to do your photoshoot during traditional working hours, if you are available then.

Again, the best approach is to keep me posted on your availability and aim to be flexible.

If planning a photoshoot during the winter months, please be mindful of the shorter daylight hours (see <u>here</u> for further details).





Are you available all year round?

Yes, I work all year round (but please don't ask me to work on Christmas Day or New Year's Day!). If you're booking a photoshoot during the low season, we might need to be a bit more mindful of the temperatures, and the conditions underfoot. Also, we might need to be more selective about which location(s) we use, as some places can look a little bit bare in winter.

Please come prepared whatever the weather, whatever time of year. For instance, spring might be sunny but it can still be really cold, especially in the shade, and I've seen some people who are not adequately wrapped up against the cold. I'll bring mats to sit on and reusable handwarmers to hold, but they're no substitute for a warm coat and gloves!

The session and the end result - the photographs - will be better if everyone is dressed appropriately.



How will we communicate?

I want you to *feel* like you're my only client, but the reality is there are *lots* of other people on my books! This means I have to be very organised with my communication. Email works best for me, as I can set up a dedicated folder for your photoshoot, and you'll receive my out-of-office reply if I'm away from my desk.

Self-employment can often feel all-consuming, and 'switching off' is an ongoing challenge for me. After your initial contact form, please stick to email until the final run up to your photoshoot, when I'll give you my WhatsApp number in case we need to communicate on the day. Please download WhatsApp to be prepared for this scenario. Please revert back to email after your photoshoot.

I'll aim to respond promptly but please remember that I'm often out at photoshoots, particularly during peak season, and I'm striving to enjoy evenings and the occasional day off away from my inbox!



What should we wear?

Depending on what proposal scenario you opt for (i.e. Options 1 to 3 above), you might not be able to influence what your partner wears! However, it would still be worthwhile reading my handy eBook which contains some advice on what to wear, and galleries to inspire you. In an ideal world, you would want to dress for the season and the location; colour coordinate but don't match; and avoid a rogue piece of clothing and big logos. If this is all going to be a complete surprise for your partner, then the best approach would be to aim to colour coordinate with whatever he/she happens to wear on the day.

Can we have an outfit change?

A full head-to-toe outfit change is included in my Deluxe Package. However, you're welcome to bring a couple of items with you (e.g. sweaters, jackets, etc.), regardless of which package you choose. This will allow for a few different 'looks' without a full-scale outfit change eating into your photography time.



What about our animals?

I'm an animal lover and always like to get our furry companions involved! I suggest we do photos with and without the fur babies. If they're present when you're popping the question, please aim to have them under control so that they're not stealing focus from the big moment in the photographs.





Do you do black and white photography?

I love using colour in my images but I also appreciate black and white photography. I'll convert some of your images to monochrome where I feel it's most effective.





Why should I pay your prices?

Understandably, a lot of people are looking for bargains these days, but please remember the long-term value of these images. To capture this precious moment in your life in a stress-free way, with top quality results, please book an experienced and reliable professional (me!).





Can you explain the package system further?

You're busy. I'm busy. I like to keep things as simple and as efficient as possible!

Some photographers take a session fee then ask their clients to choose their images afterwards. I avoid this system for several reasons! You probably don't want to be faced with a gallery of unedited images and have the hassle of deciding which ones to purchase; in fact, you might never get around to it. Equally, I wouldn't want to be kept waiting for payment long after having completed a photoshoot.

The package system serves me and my clients well. I'll handpick your best images, showcasing different backgrounds and poses from throughout the photoshoot (I say 'poses' but think of it more as 'gentle direction'). We'll likely only need to exchange a handful of emails and, as soon as I've completed your editing, all you need to do is download the images!




Do you sell products?

I offer a range of products, including branded USB drives, a range of beautifully hand-crafted albums, and wall art. Please note that additional fees would apply for overseas shipping and that I'm unable to ship wall art overseas. The photography packages include digital images only, for a couple of reasons. Firstly, a large percentage of my clients come from overseas; digital-only photography packages helps to keep things simple. Secondly, if you decide to purchase products, I want you to have free rein in your decision-making and not be tied to a particular size of album or frame.

What happens after the photoshoot?

I'll individually edit all of your photographs to a high standard. After all, I'm a perfectionist! Your images will be ready within a maximum of five weeks. Normally it'll be *much* quicker. However, please appreciate that peak season gets *extremely* busy (and I'm only human).

Your photographs will be presented in an online gallery (which you're welcome to share with family and friends). You'll also receive links to download the digital images, with high resolution files ready for printing, and low resolution files ready for you to share on social media (if you wish).

How do I book?

Please note that bookings are taken on a first come, first served basis. My diary changes daily and I'm unable to offer date savers. Your photoshoot date will only be secure once payment has been made and the booking form has been completed. Please don't put it off! My calendar fills up quickly, particularly in summer and autumn/fall.
