

We don't need to share the same interests but it's helpful if we relate to each other on some level!

I'm naturally an introvert, meaning I'm quiet and content in my own company. I love switching off from tech, getting lost in my thoughts (or a book), going for long walks and bike rides, and feeling connected to nature.

However, I also have strong leadership skills! I'll happily step up when needed, for instance, making sure a wedding runs to time and organising guests for group photos.

I feel a strong affinity with animals, especially my guinea pigs! I love a solo adventure, such as a long distance walk. I'm nostalgic and love anything that transports me back to the pre-internet days.

My favourite TV show is 'Friends'; my sense of humour! I love music (folk, classical, and 1960s-1990s rock and pop) and I enjoy the occasional concert or gig.

I rarely wear make-up and I'm usually at my happiest if I'm wearing my walking boots! I don't have a big ego and I prefer to be 'in the background'.

Who I work with...

I work with down-to-earth couples who are emotionally invested in their photography and want a natural vibe in their images. I'm not going to boss you around or upstage you! Instead, I'll put you at ease so that you can genuinely relax in front of my camera, be yourself and look beautiful in the pictures.

I'm much more than 'just' your wedding photographer. I'm here to help you plan every aspect of your special day so that, together, we can create a stunning collection of photographs without the stress of crazy time schedules or any awkwardness in front of the camera.

I've photographed hundreds of weddings, meaning I can offer an informed opinion on every aspect of your special day, from the big stuff to the finer details. I don't mean to sound at all big-headed but I encourage you to tap into this knowledge and experience when planning your wedding.





My ideal couple...

I don't aspire to photograph a particular type of *wedding*. I want to work with a particular type of *person*; someone who is emotionally invested in their wedding photography.

Let me be clear.

You don't need to look like a supermodel, and you don't need to spend hours posing in front of my camera (absolutely not). I don't mind if you're getting married on a windswept beach or in a rustic barn, posh hotel or country mansion. I don't mind if you have two guests or a hundred.

All that *really* matters to me is that you care about your wedding photography enough to engage with me so that we can plan the day together. I'm talking about unhurried time schedules and tidy backgrounds; the working conditions I need in order to produce my best photography for you.

How would I sum up my ideal wedding? It's either of these...

- * A bespoke, small and intimate wedding or elopement.
- * A larger, more traditional wedding where the timings are planned around the photography.

I've included two featured weddings towards the end of this eBook to illustrate this point.





What's your style and approach?

I combine three elements to create my signature style: candid pictures capturing real emotions; traditional, naturally posed images; and artistic photographs of all the little details.

I let events unfold naturally as much as possible. I try to blend into the background and fit in seamlessly with your guests. You and your loved ones will have real moments to look back on in years to come.


I blend this documentary approach with more classic pictures. I'll gently pose you in a way that looks and feels very natural. Don't worry, I promise it'll all be pretty informal and enjoyable.

I know you'll also want a record of all the little details that add personal touches to your day: everything from your dress to your bouquet; the seating plan to the cake topper. I'm a perfectionist, I have an eye for detail and I'll make time to capture it all.





















What's your approach to the preparations?


If your chosen photography package includes the preparations, then I'll begin by photographing the dress, shoes, accessories and flowers. This can take an hour or more. I'll then capture the final stages of hair and make-up and key moments along the way (e.g. popping open the champagne) before photographing the final touches.

If your package includes the final preparations, then please expect me to capture only the finishing touches, e.g. buttoning up the dress, putting the veil on, etc.



No offence to male photographers, but I should point out that my presence during the preparations doesn't disrupt the girly dynamic at all. I'll seamlessly blend in and will be discreet when needed, e.g. when you're getting into the dress.
























Do you have any recommendations for our ceremony?

Yes, I have lots of recommendations which I'll be happy to share with you. I can offer suggestions on ways to personalise your ceremony so that it doesn't whizz by too quickly and you have time to settle into it and overcome any nerves.


Also, I can offer lots of suggestions to ensure that I'm able to produce my best photography for you, and from a variety of angles, e.g. by ensuring seats are laid out to allow more than enough space for me to move around; and by requesting that guests put their phones and cameras away during the ceremony.




I can also advise on how best to approach any confetti shots! Please spare a thought for the environment and use biodegradable confetti, if possible.











How do you approach group shots?

The best approach to group shots is to do them straight after the ceremony, before anyone has an opportunity to wander off to the bar!

I'll ask you to provide a list (by completing an online form on my website) a few weeks before your wedding. I might re-jig the order to make the process more efficient and to prioritise pictures with grandparents and/or children.

I have a headset and loudspeaker so can make myself heard over any number of guests. However, it would still be helpful if one or two people could be on hand to help gather folks and speed up the process.

I don't impose a limit on the number of group photos but I strongly recommend we don't let this chew up *too* much time. The key is to prioritise the wedding party and your closest family, and capture everyone else in the 'whole group shot'.







How do you approach the happy couple shots?

During your pre-wedding consultation, we'll discuss your timings and whether or not you want to stay at your venue for these important photographs or whether you'd like to drive off to a scenic location. Either way, you only need to be in front of my camera for 20 to 30 minutes, so you don't need to be away from your guests for too long.

By the time we start your photographs, we'll be completely at ease with each other and you'll be used to my camera snapping away. I'll capture lots of images, in multiple settings, and I'll show you how to sit, stand or walk (or dance!) so that the photographs look very natural and not overly posed.




You might be feeling anxious about this part of the day but, don't worry, I promise that you'll end up enjoying the experience and loving the end result.


















What happens after the wedding?


I'll send you a few sample photographs within a week of your wedding, to tide you over until I'm able to complete the rest of your editing. In due course, I'll edit all of your photographs to a high standard (after all, I'm a perfectionist!).

Your images will be ready within a maximum of eight weeks. Normally, it'll be *much* quicker. However, please appreciate that peak season gets *extremely* busy (and I'm only human).

Your photographs will be presented in an online gallery which you're welcome to share with family and friends, and prints can be purchased through the gallery.



You'll also receive links to download the digital images, with high resolution files suitable for printing, and low resolution files ready for you to share on social media if you wish.



How will we communicate?


I want you to *feel* like you're my only client, but the reality is there are lots of other people on my books! This means I have to be very organised with my communication.

Email works best for me, as I can set up a dedicated folder for your wedding, and you'll receive my out-of-office reply if I'm away from my desk.

Self-employment can often feel all-consuming, and 'switching off' is an ongoing challenge for me! After your initial contact form, please stick to email and try to avoid texting or instant messaging.



I'll aim to respond promptly but please remember that I'm often out at photoshoots, particularly during peak season, and I'm striving to enjoy evenings and the occasional day off away from my inbox!



Why should we pay your prices?

Understandably, a lot of people are looking for bargains these days, but please remember the lifetime value of these images. For a flexible approach, stress-free experience, and top quality results, please book an experienced, reliable professional (me!). Buy cheap, and you'll likely regret your decision for a very long time.

The fee you pay to your photographer won't just cover their time on the day and it certainly won't go straight into their savings account. As a sole trader, I have numerous business costs to cover before I even consider my mortgage and other household bills.



Please think about the time and effort that goes into a professional photographer's marketing, so that you even know they exist (I built my website from scratch and created this eBook myself!). Don't forget that your wedding will be followed by meticulous post-production work in order to deliver the very best results.

















Here's my favourite elopement story...!

I chummed my brother to an appointment at a bank in Perth, where we were served by Jamie, the groom! We had a laugh with Jamie; he was so friendly and had a great sense of humour. He asked what I did for a living, raised his eyebrows when I told him, then he explained that he and his fiancée, Rachel, were planning to elope to Loch Morlich and needed a photographer! Being based near Inverness, the Aviemore area is very much my local patch, and my ears pricked up! I left Jamie my business card, hoping that he and Rachel would get in touch.

Sure enough, Rachel contacted me to say that she and Jamie had visited my website and loved my work. They were hoping for a relaxed and informal day so just needed photos of the ceremony and at Loch Morlich afterwards. Also, Rachel explained that the elopement was a secret and invited me to be a witness, and did I know anyone who could be a second witness?! I replied with my quote and said that me and my husband, Mark, would be delighted to oblige!





We had a video call closer to the big day; it felt like catching up with old friends! We have a shared love of the Highlands and Rachel and Jamie had recently purchased their first touring caravan (I'm a life-long caravanner and caravanning is my favourite topic of conversation!). We eventually remembered to chat about the elopement before Zoom cut out after 45 minutes!

Jamie mentioned that he had a surprise (Rachel looked nervous!) and said he'd call me. Rachel's expectations were low; she suspected a trip to the chippy! Jamie revealed to me that, when he and Rachel had been on holiday in Gothenburg, they'd gone to see some classic cars. Rachel had pointed to a vintage Volvo and remarked, "that would be perfect for a wedding!" Jamie took note and managed to book the same model (in white!) as a self-drive hire car from Dingwall. Now, he just had to come up with a good excuse for slipping out of the hotel for a couple of hours while Rachel would be getting her hair and make-up done. Jamie invented a story about having a sore back, so that he could slip off for a massage! Rachel bought the story, and the vintage car was booked.





So far, so good... apart from the weather forecast.

I couldn't believe my eyes when checking the weather app and looking out the window in horror a few hours before the ceremony. The rain was bucketing down! I felt bad for them both, but particularly for Jamie, who I imagined to be driving through surface water on the A9 in a 1960s Volvo.

My husband and I arrived at Loch Morlich with time to spare, laden with umbrellas! Rachel and Jamie arrived and, thankfully, had been chauffeur-driven by Graham, the car owner, who had taken pity on Jamie and had taken over the driving. Gillian, the registrar, led the way down to the beach and the ceremony went ahead, under a tree (and umbrella), at the spot where Jamie had proposed to Rachel.

Lots of ducks immediately waddled over, quacking! For the exchanging of the rings, Graham stepped forward and held the couple's umbrella, so that Rachel and Jamie had their hands free. Meanwhile, Mark was holding an umbrella over me and my two cameras!





The couple kissed and, miraculously, the rain eased off. Gillian wanted the paperwork to be signed in a dry place, so we made our way over to the Boathouse Café. Never one to miss a photo opportunity, I asked Rachel and Jamie to walk via the shore. The ducks joined them, and the clouds started to lift off the Cairngorms in the background. We signed the marriage register in the warmth of the café and ogled at the cakes and traybakes before heading back outside, where Rachel and Jamie grabbed a selfie!

The weather looked to be improving but I was conscious that Graham needed to head back to Dingwall with his vintage Volvo. I pitched my plan and everyone got on board! I led the way up the road to Cairngorm Mountain and pulled in at a deserted layby with great views towards Loch Morlich and Aviemore. We shot various pictures with the vintage car then Rachel and Jamie waved as Graham drove it away down the hill. I then captured lots of images of the bride and groom in the beautiful landscape before we jumped in my car and Mark handed Rachel some handwarmers; her hands were freezing!






The wind whipped up back at Loch Morlich, but Rachel and Jamie were troopers and were determined to get some photographs at a lovely spot I'd picked out in the woods. After a few natural poses, I asked the bride and groom to have a wee dance, to help Rachel warm up a bit! It helped, although I could still see goosebumps and purple hands through my viewfinder!

We headed back to the Boathouse Café, keen to express our gratitude at having been able to use it for signing the marriage register earlier on. Rachel and Jamie treated Mark and I to coffee and cake. We chatted (about caravanning, of course!) while looking out at the beautiful view over the loch. Finally, we dropped Rachel and Jamie at their hotel in Aviemore, where they were planning on relaxing and having dinner in their room.

Rachel and Jamie had a wonderful day, as did Mark and I. It was an absolute privilege to witness and photograph their beautiful elopement, and I'm thrilled that the weather eventually played ball! We've definitely become friends and it's remarkable that it all started with a trip to the bank! Serendipity!


























And now for my favourite more traditional wedding...!

I'm not going to lie. I felt a little nervous when Fiona booked me for her wedding to Callum at Mar Lodge. Why? Well, it was my first time at this iconic venue, and Fiona, more than any bride I'd previously worked with, was incredibly specific about what she wanted from the photography.

Fiona had booked my 'extended coverage' package upgrade, meaning I was 'on the go' for even longer than usual, but I honestly enjoyed every minute! Mar Lodge is a photographer's dream with spacious rooms and lots of natural light, and the impressive and peaceful grounds looked stunning in autumn.

Fiona's attention to detail was on a par with my own; something I really appreciated. She was so invested in the photography that she was more than happy to listen to my recommendations in the run up to the wedding, and the time schedule allowed the day to unfold at an unhurried pace, allowing me to produce my best photography in an unobtrusive way.






For instance, let me tell you how I photographed the ceremony.

The ceremony room has a beautiful bay window. It made sense for me to stand in that space, with natural light coming over my shoulder, lighting the bride and groom. This meant that I didn't need to use flash and people could almost forget I was there.

The celebrant, Elaine, stood between me and the couple. When Fiona and Callum made eye contact with Elaine, I got a clear view of their facial expressions. This was refreshing because, all too often, in other venues, there's not enough space for me to stand behind the celebrant, or a flower arch will have been positioned in such a way that it blocks my view from key angles.

There were four readings by family members during the ceremony. Counterintuitively, Fiona and I arranged for them to stand opposite me, instead of taking the place of the celebrant. This meant I could photograph the readings without having to repeatedly cross the room or shoot towards the bay window with flash.





I don't need anyone to fully understand the technical reasoning behind my recommendations. I'm just looking for my clients to put their faith in me and trust that I'll be able to deliver better results if my advice is heeded. Fiona was 100% on board with this and everyone was delighted with the photographs, myself included.

Another reason I loved this wedding so much was Fiona's crafting! She's a home economics teacher and naturally very creative. Single-handedly, Fiona made the invitations, a map, the order of service, signs, the seating plan, centrepieces, favours, and bunting. She even baked two wedding cakes! For me, not only was it a delight to photograph all these beautiful details, but I also really appreciated the sustainability ethic. Fiona left many of her decorations at Mar Lodge so that they can be re-used at future weddings.




After the ceremony and confetti toss, Fiona and Callum popped open a bottle of champagne with a sword belonging to Fiona's uncle! I then took the bride and groom along to the Victoria Bridge over the River Dee. One of the groomsmen joined us; it's often helpful to have another pair of hands. After capturing the newlyweds and the beauty of the estate, we rounded up the wedding party and Fiona and Callum's families for group photos on the lawn.

With the formal photography completed, Fiona and Callum had plenty of time to relax and mingle with their guests, sip champagne and nibble canapés while I moved around capturing candid images. Everyone then gathered in the Great Hall for cake cutting before being piped over to the magnificent Stag Ballroom for speeches and dinner. Again, because Fiona had carefully considered the schedule, I'd already had ample time to pop over to the ballroom (while the drinks reception was ongoing in the lodge) to capture the set-up: the array of antlers on the ceiling; and Fiona's many hand-crafted decorations.








Fiona and Callum's vision for their wedding was a relaxed and fun-filled weekend with their families and friends, and that's exactly what they got.

The Mar Lodge Estate was able to accommodate the guests in the apartments, cottages and bunkhouse, meaning the celebrations started on the Friday night with a welcome buffet dinner and drinks, and continued into the Sunday with a buffet lunch, rounders and football on the lawn, snooker in the billiards room, a quiz in one of the cottages, and peaceful walks on the estate. My photography packages include digital images only, for a couple of reasons. Firstly, a large proportion of my clients come from overseas; digital-only photography packages helps to keep things simple. Secondly, if you decide to purchase products, I want you to have free rein in your decision-making and not be tied to a particular size of album or frame.

I offer a wide range of package upgrades, including engagement photoshoots, extended coverage, and a second photographer. I also offer a range of products, including branded USB drives, and beautifully hand-crafted albums and wall art in a variety of sizes. Please note that additional fees apply for overseas shipping and I'm unable to ship wall art overseas.

Get used to being around the camera before the wedding and capture some special images for your save-the-date cards and invitations!


There are three options to choose from:

- ★ Classic: 30 minutes of coverage for £250.
- ★ Signature: 1 hour of coverage for £375.
- ★ Deluxe: 2 hours of coverage for £550.

Photoshoots take place in the Inverness / Black Isle area, and I can gladly recommend some great locations.

Please note that restrictions apply with the Classic Package, and travel fees may apply further afield.





Extended coverage with Karen Thorburn Photography...

Here are the challenges I face when trying to secure a second photographer: 1) finding someone who has enough experience and whose work is up to scratch, but isn't tied up with their own photography business; and 2) finding someone who will commit to your date and not pull out.

As an alternative to hiring a second photographer, you have the option of extending my time on the day. I'll start an hour earlier than usual, finish after the first six dances, take a shorter break, and work even harder than usual. Phew!

Of course, I can't be in two places at once, but one advantage of this approach is greater consistency across the photographs, with everything captured by myself. The additional fee is £400, to cover my extra time in post-production as well as on the day itself.

If you have a family, you'll want your wedding photographs to be passed down the generations, from your children to your grandchildren.

My albums come in a range of sizes, from a cute 6" x 6" Mini Album to an impressive 14" x 11" Deluxe Storybook.

Most of my couples go for something in between. My 8" x 10" Classic Album is the most popular choice.

Naturally, quality products come with a price tag to match. However, I've found a way to make these albums available to each and every one of my couples.

There's lots of flexibility with the Classic and Deluxe Storybook Albums in terms of the number of pages and image layouts.

I'll find a design that works for you and will gladly tweak it until it's absolutely perfect.
